THE PHILOSOPHY

The strategy is actively managed and benchmarked against the 3-month EURIBOR. The philosophy of the strategy is centred around Floating Rate Notes (FRN). These have a variable coupon linked to a reference rate,. FRNs still possess credit risk, however unlike fixed bonds whose prices generally we believe fall as yields adjust upwards, FRNs typically retain their value regardless of the prevailing interest rate environment.

WHY CHOOSE THIS STRATEGY?

POTENTIAL FOR HIGHER INCOME AND CAPITAL PROTECTION

Inverted yield curves currently offer investors scope for harvesting higher income at shorter maturities. Combined with the limited duration risk offered by floating rate credit, short-dated floating rate credit may additionally provide enhanced capital protection versus fixed rate bonds should yields rise further.

ATTRACTIVE VALUATIONS

After successive rate hikes, corporate credit spreads have widened considerably causing a revaluation of credit markets, offering an attractive entry point.

ISSUER RESILIENCE

Corporate balance sheets are healthy and look able to withstand weaker economic environment. In this sense, default risk appears modest for sub-investment grade issuers.



BNY MELLON FLOATING RATE CREDIT STRATEGY

OBJECTIVE

The Strategy aims to generate a return of income and capital growth through investing in a global portfolio of floating rate debt and debt related securities and related FDI.

BENCHMARK

The Strategy will measure its performance against the 3-month EURIBOR (the "Cash Benchmark"). EURIBOR is the Euro Interbank Offer Date and is a reference rate that is constructed from the average interest rate at which Eurozone banks offer unsecured short-term lending on the inter-bank market.

The Strategy uses the Cash Benchmark as a target against which to measure its performance on a rolling annualized 3-year basis after fees.

The Strategy is actively managed, which means the Investment Manager has discretion over the selection of investments, subject to the investment objective and policy.

KEY INVESTMENT RISKS
