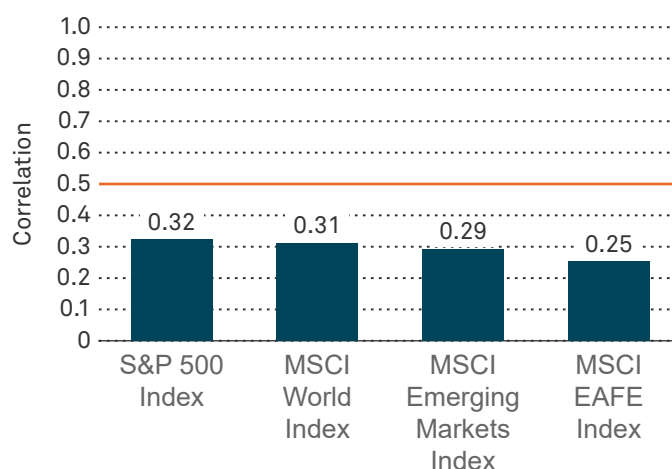

Fund Objective

The fund seeks to maximize total return while realizing a market level of income consistent with preserving principal and liquidity.

Investment Process/Philosophy

- The investment team believes that the value of active portfolio management is the conversion of active risk into alpha.
- The investment team assesses relative value, makes sector allocation decisions and selects among “best ideas,” all while adjusting for risk budget and client preferences.
- Seeking consistent outperformance requires both top-down and bottom-up expertise. Teams of experienced professionals must use both quantitative and fundamental methods to identify value in both macro and idiosyncratic positions.
- The search for value drives the investment process. Purchasing securities and/or sectors that are undervalued increases the probability of positive investment outcomes.

Risks

Definitions

Beta is a measure of a security's or portfolio's volatility, or systematic risk. **Alpha** is a measure of selection risk in relation to the market. A positive alpha is the extra return awarded to the investor for taking a risk instead of accepting the market. **Standard deviation** is a statistical measure of the degree to which an individual portfolio return tends to vary from the mean, based on the entire population. **R-squared** is a statistical measure that represents the percentage of a fund's or security's movements that are explained by movements in a benchmark index. **Information ratio** measures a portfolio manager's ability to generate excess returns relative to a benchmark. **Sharpe ratio** is a risk-adjusted measure that measures reward per unit of risk. The higher the Sharpe ratio, the better. **Duration** is a measure of volatility expressed in years. The higher the number, the greater the potential for volatility as each respective country's local interest rate changes. **Average Effective Duration** is used to measure the market price sensitivity of the fund's portfolio holdings to changes in interest-rates. **Average Effective Maturity** is the weighted average of the effective maturity dates of the fixed-income securities in the fund's holdings. It does not take into account the fund's use of leverage. **CTD (contribution to duration)** measures the amount in years each country's bond constituents contribute to the total duration of the portfolio. **NAV** is Net Asset Value. **FDIC** is Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. **YTD** is Year to Date. **Yrs** is years. **CFA®** and **Chartered Financial Analyst®** are registered trademarks owned by the CFA Institute. **USD** is United States Dollar. **IG** is Investment Grade. **HY** is High Yield. **ABS** is Asset-Backed Securities. **RMBS** is Residential Mortgage-Backed Securities. **CMBS** is Commercial Mortgage-Backed Securities.
