# **INSIGHT'S APPROACH**

Insight seeks to help our clients achieve their desired outcomes and to reflect their priorities. This lies at the heart of Insight's approach to responsible investment.

Insight assess and identify, and take responsibility for managing, factors Insight deems to be financially material (including, but not limited to, sustainability and governance factors) whilst also reflecting client sustainability preferences.

Financially material sustainability risks can be 'direct' in that they are identifiable, can be more straightforward to quantify, and typically occur over the nearer term, such as pollution fines or product safety issues. They can also be 'indirect' and may have multiple pathways to financial relevance; quantification is more complex as they typically stem from broader issues that impact the whole economy over the long term. Examples are extreme heat and water scarcity.

Building on these foundations, Insight's ambition for the Responsible Horizons range is to create an industry-leading range of investment strategies for clients that wish to place sustainability considerations at the heart of their investment allocations.

Investors face a wide variety of terms relating to responsible investment and ESG factors, some with varying definitions. To help investors, our responsible investment glossary defines a range of key terms and initiatives.



In Insight's experience, ESG factors can develop into material risks that undermine the value of an investment.

Insight's Prime ESG ratings are based on multiple data inputs and aim to highlight key issues for analysis and engagement.

Insight tap into the market of 'use of proceeds' bonds like green and social bonds, and companies with revenue linked to the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

Insight's impact bond assessment framework aims to help ensure such assets fulfil their promises.

Providing finance to issuers in some industries could have a negative environmental or social impact.

Insight's data, credit analysis and governance processes apply specified exclusions and thresholds to ensure Insight's funds avoid such sectors.

Insight pay close attention to companies with greater potential for an environmental impact and seek to exclude those with exposure to fossil fuel extraction, and significant exposure to coal, oil and gas. The strategies also support net-zero goals through allocations to impact bonds, and in some cases, through explicit targets regarding net-zero alignment and carbon intensity of portfolios' corporate holdings.

Demonstrating the application of responsible investment

Insight has developed in-depth reporting to offer transparency on various metrics, including TCFD measures. impact indicators and social metrics.

# Overview: The Responsible Horizons Euro Impact Bond Fund

Investors are increasingly seeking a positive environmental or social impact with their assets, but it can be difficult to know how or to know the difference your investment makes.

The Responsible Horizons Euro Impact Bond Fund aims to be an important building block for investors who want to achieve a positive environmental and social impact alongside financial returns.

# **FEATURES**

- Focus on meaningful impact: Insight believes that fixed income investors have a unique opportunity to achieve impact primarily due to the huge growth in the 'use-of-proceeds' bond market where investors can fund specific projects with environmental and social impacts. The Fund aims to focus on this opportunity, looking through both an environmental and social lens, by investing predominantly in use-of-proceeds impact bonds. It will also seek to broaden the impact achieved by allocating to 'positive impact issuers', which are companies with a high level of alignment to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- Longer-term focus: By adopting a 'long-term active' approach Insight seeks to align the Fund with the longer-term time horizon over which impact factors typically play out. This also encourages a partnership approach with issuers which could lead to more impactful outcomes.
- Bias towards corporate issuers: Through a corporate focus Insight aims to maximise the potential return achievable, meaning Insight can target a higher level of return while also seeking a positive impact.

### TABLE 1: KEY FACTS<sup>1</sup>

#### **Investment Objective**

To achieve positive environmental and/or social impacts while generating a total return comprised of income and capital growth by investing in a broad range of Euro-denominated debt and debt-related securities and related financial derivative instruments ("FDI").

#### Investment universe

The investment universe is adjusted by excluding:

- All issuers with a worst-in-class prime ESG rating, and all corporate issuers with a worst-in-class prime climate risk rating.<sup>1</sup>
- All companies in breach of widely accepted global conventions such as the UN global compact principles.
- All companies materially involved in tobacco, gambling, adult entertainment, cannabis, nuclear power and alcohol production.
- All companies with over 5% of revenues from coal mining and power generation, and utilities with over 30% in their fuel mix.
- All companies with worst-in-class carbon intensity (over 2,000 tonnes per US\$1 million sales).
- Impact bonds rated 'red' by insight's impact bond assessment.
- Issuers that fail a principal adverse impacts (PAI) screen unless alternative mitigating action is deemed appropriate.

#### Performance Benchmark

The Fund will measure its performance against the Bloomberg MSCI Euro Corporate Green Bond TR Index, (the "Benchmark"). The Fund is actively managed, which means the Investment Manager has discretion to invest outside the Benchmark subject to the investment objective and policy. However, as the Benchmark covers a significant proportion of the investable universe, the majority of the Fund's holdings will be constituents of the Benchmark and the weightings in the portfolio may be similar to those of the Benchmark. The investment strategy will restrict the extent to which the portfolio holdings may deviate from the Benchmark and consequently the extent to which the Fund can outperform the Benchmark.

# Positive allocation themes<sup>1</sup>

- Target of minimum 75% in 'use-of-proceeds' bonds.
- Minimum 50% of NAV in use-of-proceeds green bonds.
- Maximum 25% of NAV in non use-of-proceeds bonds from positive impact issuers.

# SUSTAINABILITY INFORMATION

The Fund has sustainable investment as its objective pursuant to Article 9 of the EU Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation (SFDR). The Fund is subject to and managed to achieve compliance with the ESMA ESG and Sustainability-Related Fund Naming Guidelines.

# MINIMUM ALLOCATION TO SFDR SUSTAINABLE INVESTMENTS: 90% NAV

The Fund will invest in three types of SFDR Sustainable Investments:

- Use-of-proceeds impact bonds whose proceeds will be exclusively applied to finance or re-finance in part or in full projects with positive environmental and/or social impacts using the UN SDGs as a guide to environmental targets and/or are defined as "environmentally sustainable economic activities" by the EU Taxonomy Regulation.
- Debt securities issued by impact issuers where at least 50% of the issuer's revenue streams are linked to positive environmental and/or social activities which contribute to the UN SDGs or where at least 50% of their economic activities are compliant with the EU Taxonomy Regulation.
- Debt securities issued by improving issuers where core investment plans (affecting at least 50% of the issuer's revenue streams, capital expenditure, and/or operating expenditure including non-capitalised costs that represent research and development) are compliant with the EU Taxonomy Regulation.

# PRINCIPLE ADVERSE IMPACTS (PAIS)

The adverse impacts of investment decisions on sustainability factors are considered for this Fund from the perspective of the harm that investment positions might do externally to sustainability factors, and what steps are taken to mitigate that harm.

# BINDING ELEMENTS OF THE FUND'S INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Fund will:

- Invest at least 90% of NAV (net of those investments intended for specific purposes such as hedging and liquidity) in SFDR Sustainable Investments
- Invest at least 75% of NAV in use-of-proceeds impact bonds
  - The Investment Manager uses its own research and credit analysis to rate use-of-proceeds impact bonds as outlined in the Supplement and will not invest in use-of-proceeds impact bonds that are rated red i.e. the worst rating
- Apply the Paris-aligned benchmark (PAB) exclusions, as referred to in the ESMA ESG and Sustainability-Related Fund Naming Guidelines, by excluding investments providing exposure to:
  - Companies involved in any activities related to controversial weapons

- Companies involved in the cultivation and production of tobacco
- Companies that the Investment Manager, in its sole discretion, assesses to be in violation of the United Nations Global Compact (UNGC) principles or the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises
- Companies that derive 1% or more of their revenues from exploration, mining, extraction, distribution or refining of hard coal and lignite
- Companies that derive 10% or more of their revenues from the exploration, extraction, distribution or refining of oil fuels
- Companies that derive 50% or more of their revenues from the exploration, extraction, manufacturing or distribution of gaseous fuels
- Companies that derive 50% or more of their revenues from electricity generation with a GHG intensity of more than 100g CO2 e/kWh
- The Fund may still gain exposure to corporate issuers otherwise excluded under the Paris-aligned benchmark exclusions above if:
  - The investments are in European Green Bonds, or
  - The investments are in use-of-proceeds instruments other than European Green Bonds which the Investment Manager determines, in its sole discretion, on a lookthrough basis, do not finance any activities referred to in the PAB exclusions
- Also exclude from investment corporate issuers that, in the opinion of the Investment Manager:
  - Derive more than 5% of their revenue from metallurgical coal extraction unless the exposure is achieved via use-of-proceeds impact bonds
  - Derive more than 10% of their revenue from coal power generation
  - Derive more than 5% of their revenue from gambling
- Not have exposure to issuers who derive more than 5% of revenue from involvement in nuclear power generation except where, in the opinion of the Investment Manager: (i) They fulfil nuclear and environmental safety requirements; and (ii) The instruments purchased are Use of Proceeds Impact Bonds; and (iii) The instruments purchased do not specifically fund nuclear activity









# How Insight thinks about impact

Most of Insight's integration processes focus on ensuring that relevant ESG risks are considered as part of the investment process. However, for mandates with a sustainability and impact emphasis, there can also be an additional focus within the mandate considering the impact of investments on the environment and/or society.

Insight has identified three opportunity sets to achieve impact: impact bonds, impact issuers and improving issuers. Below Insight outlines the impact assessment approaches used to analyse these instruments and their applicability as sustainable investments.

# IMPACT BONDS (USE-OF-PROCEEDS BONDS)

In fixed income specifically, there is an explicit opportunity set for impact because of the impact bond market, which delineates the projects the issuance is funding. Insight believes it is important that, rather than accepting green labels, Insight conducts due diligence to understand the true impact these investments are likely to make and to avoid greenwashing. Below is Insight's assessment approach, which specifically pertains to impact (also known as use-of-proceeds) bonds. Insight also has a separate approach to assess sustainability-linked bonds.

Insight assesses impact bonds on a bond-by-bond basis. These include green, social and sustainability bonds. An impact bond is a bond that specifies its proceeds will be used to have a positive environmental or social impact.

Each impact bond will be given a red, light green or dark green rating, as explained in Table 2.

An impact bond with a red rating is not eligible for investment in the Responsible Horizons Euro Impact Bond Fund.

### **APPROACH**

- The issuer fails to provide sufficient information regarding their impact bond framework and has no secondparty opinion.
- Proceeds are being used for full refinancing of projects and largely target operating expenditures or no information has been provided.
   Proceeds are financing projects that are considered to have weak impact.
- Unallocated proceeds may be used to pay back existing debt and there is no commitment to allocation/ impact reporting.
- The issuer fails Insight's 'do no significant harm' screen and enhanced ESG due diligence on the issuer and the proceeds from the bond do not mitigate these negative impacts.
- Overall impact of the use of proceeds is low relative to peers.

#### APPROACH

- The issuer has an impact bond framework, aligned with ICMA standards, in place along with a second-party opinion.
- The majority of projects being financed are well defined and will provide some positive environmental and/or social impact.
- Proceeds are being used for full/partial refinancing, but limited information is provided on the split.
- The issuer has committed to annual allocation and impact reporting with limited information on key performance indicators for reporting.
- A company is defined as an impact issuer with an impact bond framework and second-party opinion in place.
- Overall impact of the use of proceeds is good relative to peers, but some information may be missing with some weaker aspects.

#### **APPROACH**

- The issuer has provided detailed information on their framework along with a second party opinion and has provided a rough split on the expected level of financing/refinancing with a maximum look back period for any refinancing <2 years.</li>
- The issuer has a project evaluation committee in place to select, evaluate and monitor use of proceeds and clear transparent process to manage proceeds effectively.
- The issuer has committed to annual allocation and impact reporting, with relevant key performance indicators (KPIs), which has been independently verified by a third party.
- The issuer passes Insight's 'do no significant harm' screen and has an appropriate sustainability strategy in place that the impact bond is clearly contributing to.
- Overall impact of the use of proceeds is strong relative to peers.

# HOW INSIGHT GENERATES RATINGS FOR IMPACT (USE OF PROCEEDS) BONDS

There are three main areas that impact bonds are assessed against: ESG performance, bond framework principles and bond impact. This is aligned with the ICMA Green Bond Principles, 5 Social Bond Principles and Sustainability Bond Guidelines, 7 as well as the European Green Bond Standard.8

#### **ESG PERFORMANCE**

As part of the assessment, Insight reviews an issuer's overall ESG performance which includes assessing their sustainability strategy, impact revenue generated (meaning that if Insight classifies the issuer as an 'impact investor', Insight will measure revenue aligned with the UN SDGs), and enhanced due diligence is conducted to assess any significant harm being conducted. In this review, Insight considers the following:

- Insight Prime ESG rating.
- Insight Prime climate risk rating.
- Controversies and associated material ESG risks in the past 12 months.
- Alignment with Principal Adverse Impacts (PAIs) as outlined by Sustainable Financial Disclosure Regulation (SFDR).
- Sustainability strategy compared to peers and relevance of impact financing.
- Net-zero alignment and targets particularly relevant for climate-focused green bonds.
- Alignment of issuer's revenue with the UN SDGs.
- Impact issuers, as defined under Insight's sustainable investment definition.

Companies deemed to exhibit inadequate performance will not be eligible for classification as a sustainable investment, may not be eligible for investment in Responsible Horizons strategies and may not be eligible for other sustainability-focused mandates. Insight's analysts pay close attention to companies with:

- High-profile controversial events.
- Weak history of ESG activities.
- Lagging ESG performance versus peers.
- Sustainability strategy, commitments and targets.
- Net-zero misalignment and targets.
- Misalignment with PAIs and SDGs.

# IMPACT BOND FRAMEWORK PRINCIPLES

Insight considers the overall framework associated with the bond, based on the ICMA Green Bond Principles, Social Bond Principles and Sustainability Bond Guidelines. Insight aims to take this a step further to encourage best practice and ensure a positive impact is being achieved.

In its framework Insight requires an impact bond issuer to have sufficient information in the following categories:

- Use of proceeds (UoP): At a minimum, Insight expects UoP categories, and a description of what projects would be considered within each category, to be provided. To strengthen the framework, Insight would expect there to be appropriate minimum levels/thresholds for categories and whether they are aligned with any official or market-based taxonomies. Insight typically looks for UoP to be aligned with the ICMA Principles' project mappings and SDGs to ensure the validity of projects. Sector-specific considerations on the suitability of proceeds will be taken into account. Explicitly outlining activities that are excluded also help to strengthen frameworks. For social projects appropriate target populations must be outlined.
- Project evaluation and selection: At a minimum, a robust and independent process should be noted as part of the framework, including a description of the steps that are taken to evaluate and select eligible projects. This should include a set of criteria for exclusions or management of ESG risks and negative impacts associated with UoP; this can include details of the issuer's internal policies and specific due diligence steps undertaken.
- Project evaluation committee: To manage the selection and monitoring of UoP, Insight would prefer issuers to have a separate working group or separate committee to effectively manage the process. A clear description of the sustainability expertise and appropriateness of those responsible for project evaluation and selection should be communicated.
- Management of proceeds: A clear description of how proceeds will be managed and tracked by the issuer to ensure proceeds are allocated towards eligible projects should be provided. This can either be on a bond-by-bond approach or portfolio approach. A high level of transparency is required here. The timeline for full allocation and the process for reinvestment should be outlined.
- Financing/refinancing: Insight's preference is for the proceeds to be used for new financing projects, but Insight recognises that certain projects may require refinancing.
   Fully refinanced projects will be considered alongside the impact associated with the use of proceeds, but typically

will lead to a light green rating. If it is full refinancing or if the split isn't known, then attention will be paid to the maximum lookback period (how old a refinanced project may be under the framework).

 Reporting: At a minimum, issuers must provide complete transparency on the use of proceeds and the associated impact through reporting relevant KPIs, Insight expects this to be supplied 1 year after issuance. Insight's preference is for independent verification and for impact reporting to be aligned with the ICMA Harmonised Framework for Impact Reporting.

# **BOND IMPACT**

Insight's analysts will consider the positive impact of the bond. This is a qualitative and quantitative assessment. A qualitative assessment will consider:

- Tangible change in strategy and the 'ambitions' of the issuer.
- Links to organic growth versus business as usual.
- If the bond will increase impact-related revenue, capital expenditure would be preferred over operating expenditure.
- Comparison to sector peers and whether the framework is appropriate for the sector.

 Whether processes are in place to mitigate any material ESG risks to ensure the impact bond is aligned with 'do no significant harm' (DNSH) criteria.

A quantitative assessment will consider:

- Business synergies, capital increase from green activities.
- Positive sustainability activity, including efficiencies and appropriateness of individual metrics.
- Negative sustainability activity, including individual metrics.

# **IMPACT ISSUERS**

'Impact issuers', as defined by Insight, are companies that have at least 50% of their revenue linked to activities deemed to have a positive environmental and/or social impact and that demonstrate no material misalignment with the UN SDGs.

Where a company is identified as an impact issuer, verified by an assessment of UN SDG alignment, Insight applies a modified assessment criteria for its bonds to take into account the likely impact being delivered by the company. The process for assessing if a company can be considered an impact issuer is outlined below.

# **IMPROVING ISSUERS**

'Improving issuers', as defined by Insight, are companies that have a significant proportion of their core investment plans linked to activities deemed to have a positive environmental impact as measured by alignment to the EU Taxonomy Regulation. The process for assessing if a company can be considered an improving issuer is outlined below.

Insight has partnered with Luxembourg Green Exchange (LGX), an external data provider, to evaluate the impact generated via impact bond investments in the Responsible Horizons Euro Impact Bond Fund.

Insight encourages issuers to adopt best practice including disclosure of reporting methodologies and assumptions made, as well as contributing to market standardisation. Insight has outlined below the methodology used to measure impact generated.

# **IMPACT BONDS**

In Insight's view, it is best practice for issuers of impact bonds to release a framework explaining the structure and approach of their impact bond, alongside a second-party opinion, before issuance. Within this framework, Insight believes companies should at a minimum commit to providing post-issuance allocation and impact reporting. Reporting is typically provided one year after issuance.

Impact bonds issued by companies that do not have a framework in place, do not commit to post-issuance reporting, and/or fail to provide post-issuance reporting after a given timeline, receive a red rating under Insight's impact bond assessment approach and are not eligible for investment by the Fund (please see page 8 for more information on Insight's approach to assessing impact bonds).

Data provider LGX collects issuers' pre- and post-issuance documents and extracts, using artificial intelligence tools, relevant allocation and impact data. Data is standardised by converting raw data derived from documentation to EUR, before being recalibrated at bond level in a standardised format which enables aggregation of data at the portfolio level.<sup>11</sup>

Data is aggregated at the portfolio level to provide overall UN SDG alignment, impact outcome key performance indicators (KPIs), and impact bond project allocation data.
